### **Inane Trivia**

<u>Tom Hanks</u> was not paid for this film. Instead, he took percentage points which ultimately netted him in the region of forty million dollars.

The line, "My name is Forrest Gump. People call me Forrest Gump," was ad libbed by <u>Tom Hanks</u> while filming the scene, and director <u>Robert Zemeckis</u> liked it so much that he decided to keep it in.

With every transition of Forrest's age, one thing remains the same. In the first scene of each transition, he wears a blue plaid shirt.

<u>Tom Hanks'</u> younger brother, <u>Jim Hanks</u>, doubled for him in many of his numerous running sequences.

The necklace worn by Lieutenant Dan is a rosary with a Saint Christopher medal, inscribed "Protect Us In Combat." It was worn in Vietnam by <u>Garv Sinise</u>'s brother-in-law, Jack Treese, in 1967-68.

During the ping-pong matches, there was no ball; it was entirely CGI, animated to meet the actors' paddles.

Gary Sinise's lower legs were wrapped in a special blue fabric that allowed them to be digitally removed later.
